Visual Art is 2D art (flat art) and 3D art!

- Examples of 2D art include: drawing, painting, collage, print making
- Examples of 3D art include: crafts, sculpture, sewing, computer generated images, dioramas, jewelry, kites, metal work, and even mobiles and wind chimes

This Year's Theme Is "I Matter Because..."

A theme is a fancy way of saying what your art is about. You can think about it anyway you'd like. Let your mind soar! If you're having trouble getting started, try finishing the sentence, "I Matter Because..."

Let the art express your emotions, thoughts, hopes, concerns, or anything else that occurs to you. (Tip: You might want to write down or remember some of these ideas. You'll use them later in the artist statement.)

How Big Can My Art Be?

- 2D art should be 24"x30" or smaller.
- 3D art needs to fit in a box that is 20"x20"x24" or smaller.

Make Sure That:

- Your art idea is original and made by you only.
- If you've seen it on a cartoon, book, or video, leave it out of your art.
- You take 1 digital picture of 2D art and 3 pictures of 3D art (top, front, and side).
- Write your **artist statement!** A thoughtful artist statement = big points in the contest! Include what stuff you used (like paint or markers) to make your art, explain what your art is about, and say what "I Matter Because..." means to you.
